The oil that is sought for in those classes of bitumens that come within the conditions before mentioned will have a specific gravity between 0.92 and 0.94. The loss on heating for seven hours at 325 F. must not exceed 5 per cent. It should be soluble in 88 naphtha to an extent of 95 per cent.
