He was the son of godly parents, members of the Presbyterian Church. He united with the Hopewell Presbyterian Church, Dandridge, Tenn., Nov.15, 1857. He joined the First Presbyterian church, Atlanta, by letter, June 4, 1868, and was ordained Elder Nov. 25, 1888. He received his college training at Mayville College, Tennessee, and Princeton College, New Jersey. From the latter college he returned home at the beginning of the Civil War and at the age of eighteen joined the Confederate army and served with distinction to the close of the war. In the spring of 1867 he entered business in Atlanta, and was a citizen of this city until his death. This is a very brief outline. To fill it in with all the noble deeds of this full and distinguished life would require a volume. I must content myself with some suggestive statements as to what he was. As a...
