Pursuant to a congressional request, GAO evaluated the Army's strategies for equipping National Guard and reserve units. GAO found that: (1) the Army and National Guard have improved equipment readiness, in both absolute terms and the dollar value of ready major equipment items; (2) shortages of some transportation and communications equipment are particularly widespread and affect unit readiness; (3) the shortages posed difficulties during the mobilization for the Gulf War and impaired mission performance during the war; (4) the Army has emphasized modernization over readiness in its procurement and distribution activities; (5) the Army frequently deviates from the Master Priority List, which is supposed to ensure that critical equipment goes to those units most likely to be involved in combat; (6) the Army equips some active combat forces less likely to fight before equipping certain support units likely to fully deploy during the early stages of a conflict; (7) the Dedicated Procurement Program, a congressionally sponsored program designed to help reserve units overcome some of the limitations imposed by the Army's procurement and distribution priorities, has directed funding to planned purchases...
