One of the most poignant expressions is Jacqueline Kennedy's memorial on the first anniversary of her husband's assassination, ". . . he died then, never knowing disillusionment." Among the women who left an imprint on the White House in earlier administrations, Sarah Polk is celebrated for intellectual endowment and was probably the only first lady to serve as her husband's secretary. Fortright comments from Martha Washington and Helen Taft shed light on the administrations of their husbands. Hay, professor of drama at the University of California, offers colorful footnotes to the main events of the American presidency. 1988.
