Scott Fitzgerald began writing a series of stories about Basil Duke Lee, a fictionalized version of his younger self. Ranging in time from his childhood in Buffalo, New York, to his entrance into Princeton University in 1913, these nine tales which include "That Kind of Party," "The Perfect Life," and "Forging Ahead" are as close to a memoir as anything the author ever wrote. A few years later, Fitzgerald penned five more stories that centered around the sultry Josephine Perry, Basil's female counterpart; these include "A Nice Quiet Place," "A Snobbish Story," and "Emotional Bankruptcy." 335.
