Chesterton revered as one of the founders of distributism, wrote of the restoration of property. Trapped within what Louis Kelso and Mortimer Adler called the slavery of past savings (THE NEW CAPITALISTS, 1961), however, Belloc s insightful analysis suffered from the lack of an effective program of implementation.
