All his stories deal with similar themes and characters, showing their lives, the hardship and their work circumstances as fishermen, farmers or miners, providing an insight of maritime life and culture. Nature, family tragedies and differences between traditional and modern lifestyles are also recurring themes. Certain contrasts are especially obvious in the short story 'The Return' from the short story collection 'The Lost Salt Gift of Blood' published in 1976. The storyline is about the little boy...
