Born Annie Denton in England in 1825, she and her brother William emigrated to America in the 1840 s, where she married Alfred Cridge. She published an autobiography - My Soul's Thralldom and Its Deliverance (1856) - and wrote articles for several magazines. However, she is most well known for her suffragist work, Man's Rights; or, How Would You Like It? (1870) which presents a satirical utopian dream, where the gender roles have been reversed and women are anything but submissive.
